

Web Lab #5

This lab will show you how to name different elements with other unique or class names for CSS styling purposes and linking purposes. By naming different elements unique names, you can then link to them to aid in navigation on long pages. CSS can also use these named elements to give special styling instructions to these elements. ID is used for naming elements with a unique name. Class is used to name a group of elements the same name.

Instructions:

1. Open Dreamweaver and your webpage from your last lab assignment.
2. On each of your `<div>` elements for your Navigation, Content, and Footer modify your `<div>` tag like this `<div id="navi">`, `<div id="content">`, `<div id="footer">`
 - a. Only modify the opening tag and not the closing tag!
 - b. Also note you can only name one element with a name using `id="blah"` per page
3. Next for each of your `<h1>` tags name them with a class name for example `<h1 class="title">`
4. Name your `<p>` elements with a class name like `<p class="content">`
5. Now we are going to make two links on your page to link to the content and footer sections of your page.
 - a. Make a link at the top of your page to link to both your footer and content section.
 - b. The link should look like this `Content`
 - c. Do the same for the footer link.
6. Check to make sure your links work then validate your page using the W3C validator.
7. Submit your zipped folder to the Edmodo.
