

Web Lab #8

This lab will guide you through modifying elements in an unordered & ordered lists and your navigation bar. At the end of this lab you will be able to style your links into something more appealing than the default setting.

Instructions:

1. Open your CSS page from before in Dreamweaver.
2. The following code will change the appearance of links on your webpage
 - a. `a{text-decoration: none;}` – This gets rid of the underline normally found with links
 - b. The following code refers to the different statuses of the link and can be given different styles to indicate those different statuses.
 - c. `a:link{color: #b11;}` – `a:link` refers to a link that is unvisited and not being interacted with at all. Give it a color of your choice.
 - d. `a:visited{color: #b11;}` – `a:visited` refers to a link that has been clicked on before. Give it a color of your choice.
 - e. `a:hover{color: #f30;}` – `a:hover` refers to a link that is currently beneath the mouse pointer. Give it a color of your choice.
 - f. `a:active{color: #f30;}` – `a:active` – refers to a link that has just been clicked on. Give it a color of your choice.
3. Next we will affect the spacing and styling of the ordered & unordered lists so that the bullet points stick with your content.
4. Type in the following code into your CSS page
 - a. `ul{`
`list-style-position: inside ;}`
 - b. `ol{`
`list-style-position: inside ;}`
5. This code will do the following:
 - a. Put your bullets with your list items. Especially noticeable, if you centered your text.
6. Notice your links will now appear in the colors you chose and that they now look more like a navigation menu rather than a list of links.
7. Please modify your links using the above code
8. Validate your CSS page and submit it to Edmodo.
